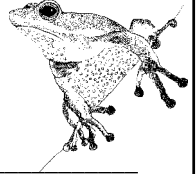




Checklist of Common Backyard Amphibians and Reptiles

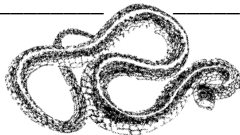
