The Path to Peace: Diplomacy in the 21st Century World

After serving as the first African-American chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Powell was appointed Secretary of State by President George W. Bush, becoming the most powerful African-American ever to hold public office. Secretary Powell was a professional soldier for 35 years, during which time he rose to the rank of 4-star General. His last assignment, until 1993, was as the 12th Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the highest military position in the Department of Defense. During this time, he oversaw 28 crises, including Operation Desert Storm in the victorious 1991 Persian Gulf War.

Secretary Powell's civilian awards include two Presidential Medals of Freedom, the President's Citizens Medal, the Congressional Gold Medal, the Secretary of State Distinguished Service Medal, and the Secretary of Energy Distinguished Service Medal.
